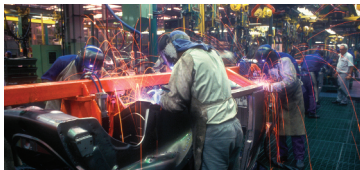


PROPOSAL 1 **Will Handcuff the New Leaders**
